
Joinery Stockists Employment Outcomes:

Examples of our practices since 2023/24:

- All our employees are paid above the minimum wage.
- We pay sick pay.
- We have a company pension scheme for all our employees.
- We have a work from home policy which is operated where practicable.
- We have given all of our staff cost of living pay rises for the past 5 years.
- We invest in our people by providing structured training to all our staff.
- We are an equal opportunities and diversity employer with requisite policies.
- We operate a structure profit share scheme which for all our employees.
- We are recruiting an apprentice.
- We care about our staff.









At Joinery Stockists Ltd:

- We recognise we ALL live on the same planet!
- We know the UK government is committed to a Net Zero target of 2050 and in the Greater Manchester region a Net Zero target of 2038.
- Our commitment to the planet is front and centre to all that we do, we continually try to adapt our trading practices to respond to changing financial and environmental climates.
- We actively source locally and responsibly and we continually re-evaluate our business approaches to drive efficiency and reduce impact on the local communities and our planet.

Joinery Stockists Environmental Outcomes:

- Restoring climate and improving air quality and offsetting
- Promoting environmentally sustainable procurement
- Supporting the environment and biodiversity conservation

Examples of our practices since 2023/24:

- We centralised our business operations and closed our Yorkshire storage hub to focus operations out of Stockport/Greater Manchester. We have retained our customer base and reduced our carbon footprint significantly by streamlining our logistics,
- We have invested in a new, more efficient, delivery vehicles.
- We have purchased a flat-bed delivery vehicle for at Euro 6 vehicle with lower emissions.
- We have re-evaluated our logistics programming / planning to ensure that our delivery schedules to customers are as efficient as possible to reduce protect the planet and help with efficiencies.
- We make sure that our orders to our suppliers are full loads where possible to reduce freight miles.
- We source and use the local supply chain where we can where we have strong and trusted relationships and focus on sustainable products.
- Our products are all manufactured from sustainable sources; we have appropriate FSC and PEFC Certification to evidence the source of our products.

- We have internal processes to track our products and we are audited annually to maintain our registration /certifications.
- We have a small team, but they all live within 5 miles of the office in Stockport.
- We promote car sharing, walking and cycling to work.
- We have a work from home policy when that is practical and necessary.
- We swapped from LPG gas forklift in the warehouse to an electric forklift.
- We invested in a complete replacement of lighting in our warehouse to LED lights.
- We have invested in cloud-based IT upgrades to become less reliant on paper in our office.
- We send all our waste timber to recycling plants rather than landfill
- We mitigate any use of plastic packaging.

Our commitment is to our local place, our local economy and our local community which comes from being part of the Greater Manchester region and being an SME.

We are a business that delivers locally and understands the importance of local investment and growth by buying and supplying locally and regionally to promote sustainable supply chains within the SME business communities.






PLACE: Community

Examples of our practices since 2023/24:

We actively engage in community support programmes to improve social/ economic conditions for communities and businesses. We do this through:

• Charitable donations:

We have recently supported a charitable organisation that has helped transform thousands of young lives from disadvantaged backgrounds.

• Apprenticeships:

We have an active apprenticeship programme and by working with a local authority partner we have taken on a young apprentice who is combining work with day release college in warehouse management.

• Giving a proportion of profits back via rebates.

We currently do this with 2 of our major customers in support of local community projects.

• Encourage our staff to engage in volunteering work in the community.

One of our Directors manages the Cheshire County U18 golf squad and has done for a number of years. We support sponsoring a junior golf team with kit at a local golf club.

We actively engage in local round table events to share knowledge and shared learnings/industry best practice.

We actively engage in local forums and industry golf societies where leaders of locals businesses exchange opportunities, ideas and share local business – we had done this for >40 years.
